Carey trained and worked as an Instructor with FAUI, PADI and SSI. He has also worked as an underwater film crew for many of those years for production houses like BBC ICON Films IMAX Discovery Animal Planet National Geographic Disney Nature and local companies like Tens Totally Wild Prospero Productions Sea Films and Abyss Pictures. Carey has heavily invested into promoting local South Australian Tourism and diving.

Anita Nedosyko:



Anita is a Marine restoration practitioner involved in designing, managing, and monitoring conservation projects in Australia for [The Nature Conservancy](#). This includes project managing the construction of Windara Reef a \$4 million initiative to restore native Australian flat oyster reefs off the coast of Yorke Peninsula to bring back this threatened habitat from the brink of extinction, provide new habitat for fish and support regional economies.

Anita's previous roles have included Marine Biologist, [Saving Nemo](#) Program Coordinator at Flinders University, Environmental Consultant at FMO Solutions and Wallbridge and Gilbert and an Environmental Assessment Officer at Department of Sustainability, Environment, Water, Population and Communities.

Anita had an early fascination for marine creatures and passion for wildlife conservation. Anita has worked at Field Island, Kakadu National Park monitoring the breeding activity of Flatback Turtles. In the Saving Nemo project she researched clownfish on the Great Barrier Reef. Anita helped form the Saving Nemo Conservation Fund, a NFP program educating community about the marine aquarium fish trade. The Fund also importantly established a clownfish breeding program to supply nursery-bred fish to reduce demand on their wild-caught cousins. Anita went on to work at The Nature Conservancy (TNC). Captivated by TNC's conservation successes by working with communities to resolve complex conservation challenges. She loves their tagline '**Nature Needs People**'. "Nature is facing complex challenges around the world and it's only through collaboration that we can hope to rise to them," said Anita.
